
All scholars are welcome to take advantage of our **study tables**, (where water and healthy snacks are always

#### **Tutoring on campus**







### New requirement for high school graduating class of 2019 and beyond – College Scholar Success Program

**Beginning with the high school class of 2019**, 21st Century Scholars will be required to complete the <u>College Scholar Success Program</u> to maintain their scholarship each year of college. Just like in high school, you will be required to complete activities each year and track your progress using <u>ScholarTrack</u>.






