The OVPDEMA Study Abroad Scholarship was created in summer 2013 with funding designated by IU's Executive Vice President and IU Bloomington Provost Lauren Robel. As a need-based scholarship, the OVPDEMA Study Abroad Scholarship helps students participate in credit-bearing study abroad programs, offered through various IU departments, by providing financial assistance to cover some of the program costs.

The OVPDEMA Study Abroad Scholarship is not intended to pay for your entire study abroad program. We encourage you to seek additional sources of funding through other scholarships and grants.

Students who qualify for OVPDEMA study abroad programs and scholarships must be affiliated with one of the following programs or center:

- 21st Century Scholars Program
- Groups Scholars Program
- Hudson & Holland Scholars Program
- Academic Support Center (OVPDEMA-funded tutors only)
- Faculty and Staff for Student Excellence (FASE tutors only)

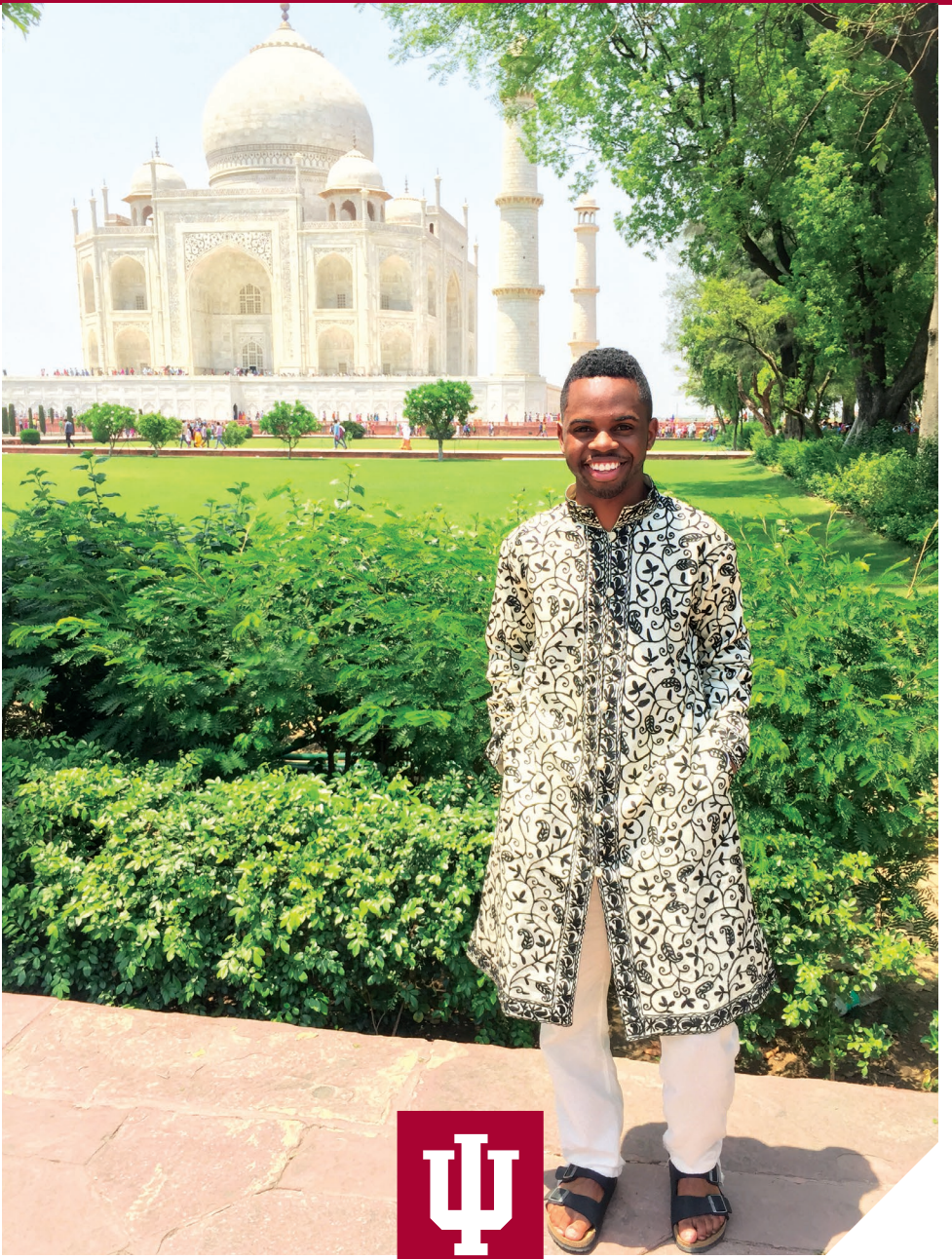

### Discover Your Study Abroad Opportunities

OVPDEMA collaborates with IU's academic departments and the Office of Overseas Study on study abroad programs that are tailored to the academic interests of students and fulfill the diversity and inclusion goals of OVPDEMA. For example, OVPDEMA's programs may include a focus on diversity, involve issues of social justice and responsibility, and emphasize multiculturalism, globalization, cross-cultural understanding, race, human rights, the African diaspora, and the history of slavery.

Currently, OVPDEMA offers three custom study abroad programs that rotate each year: Study Abroad Program to Ghana; Study Abroad Program to India; and Study Abroad Program to the Dominican Republic.

Students who are selected take classes on campus during the spring semester and travel abroad for two weeks in the summer. As part of the program, they will earn three IU credits, as well as automatic scholarships to cover the majority of expenses and hands-on support throughout the process.
